Discovering Seattle Stories: Lesson Plan Overview

The Seattle Stories program tells the history of Seattle (pre-contact through 1889) using artifacts. Students are broken into five groups to analyze and draw their two artifacts. Then the Seattle Stories book is read to the entire class. When the students' artifacts are mentioned in the story, they should then be asked to hold up their picture for the rest of the class to see. This activity will take around 40 minutes.
