Helpful Tips for Chaperones

- 1.) **Museum Manners**: You are responsible for the behavior of the students in your team! Let students know immediately if they are not meeting your expectations.
- 2.) **Be encouraging:** Encourage students to ask questions and praise them for inquisitiveness and good behavior.
- 3.) **Discuss & explore:** Use student questions as an opportunity to dive deeper. Answer questions with a hint or another question (e.g. "where could we look to find that out?" or "maybe this display can help us find out") and summarize/share student comments with team.
- 4.) **Look closely:** Ask your team these questions about objects/images you encounter:
 - •What are we looking at? What is going on here?
 - •What do you see that makes you say that?
 - •What else do you notice/what more can we find?
- 5.) **Work as a team:** Encourage students to be respectful of each other's ideas, to share materials, to take turns reading, and to work together to accomplish team goals.
- 6.) **Review:** When you are done with an activity, recap what your team did/saw/learned.
