



COVID-19 Health and Safety Policy & Protocols History Lab 2022

MOHAI follows the guidance from the CDC and Public Health – Seattle & King County in setting its COVID-19 policies and protocols. History Lab participants and guardians will be notified via emails to the provided email addresses in advance of any changes. MOHAI will strive to provide advanced notice with sufficient time to come into compliance, but this may not be possible in all circumstances.

COVID-19 Vaccination

- All participants are required to provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination before coming to this program. For now, a person is considered fully vaccinated if at least two weeks has passed since receiving the second dose of a vaccine in a two-dose vaccine, such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or if at least two weeks have passed since they received a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine.
- Valid forms of vaccination verification include:
 - A CDC COVID-19 vaccination card or a photo or photocopy of the same
 - A QR code or digital or printed certificate form MYIRmobile.com
 - A printed vaccine administration record from a vaccine provider OR
 - Any other digital vaccine card that demonstrates proof of vaccination status specified by Public Health – Seattle & King County.
- Participant's proof of COVID-19 vaccination can be uploaded through a secure DocuSign attachment or proof can be provided on or before the first day of the program to the Director of Education.
- Those at high risk for health problems resulting from COVID-19 should consult with their health care provider when considering whether to participate in History Lab.

Masks

- Masks are required for all participants and MOHAI staff, regardless of vaccination status, at all times except when actively eating or drinking.
- Masks must be well-fitted, which means the mask:
 - Is made of at least two layers of tightly woven fabric, AND
 - Completely covers the nose and mouth, AND
 - Fits snugly against the sides of the face without gaps, AND
 - Has a nose wire or similar mechanism to prevent air from leaking out the top of the mask.
- Medical procedure masks, KN95, or N95 masks are strongly encouraged. MOHAI reserves the right to determine whether a mask is acceptable under this policy.
- Unacceptable forms of masks/face coverings include but are not limited to: bandanas, face shields, t-shirts, gaiters, handkerchiefs, and valve masks.
- Participants should bring their own masks each day; however, MOHAI has a limited supply of disposable masks available for guest and participant use if needed.

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Daily Health Screenings

- All participants are required to complete a daily health screening upon arriving at MOHAI. Please ensure daily the participant does not have:
 - Fever (temperature of 100.4° F or higher) or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - A sore throat
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Nausea, diarrhea, or vomiting
 - Unusual fatigue
- If the participant is experiencing any of the above symptoms, keep them home from the program and test for COVID-19.
- If a **participant tests positive for COVID-19 by a PCR or rapid antigen test**, they can attend the History Lab program when the following criteria are met:
 - 10 days have passed since the symptoms first began or since the positive test date;
 - No symptoms are currently present or symptoms have significantly improved; AND
 - No fever within the past 72 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications
- Individuals should continue to monitor for symptoms and wear a well-fitting mask around others through day 10.
